

'Simone the Snowwoman' Ornament



To make one ornament

You will need:

3½" sq. cream print, stitchery background

5¾" sq. red print, ornament backing

4 x 1¼" x 5" each of 4 prints, log cabin

Fabric scraps for applique

3½" sq. fusible stitchery stabilizer

Thread/floss to match your fabric

10" Twine

Toy Fill

Fine tipped fabric marking pen

Light box, optional

General sewing supplies

'Simone The Snowwoman' Ornament



Have fun making this sweet, simple ornament for you and your friends.

Assemble the Front:

From 4 assorted prints cut:-

- 1) $1 \times 1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$
- 2) $1 \times 1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 4\frac{1}{4}''$
- 3) $1 \times 1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 4\frac{1}{4}''$
- 4) $1 \times 1\frac{1}{4}'' \times 5''$



From stitchery background fabric cut:-

$1 \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ square

From ornament backing fabric cut:-

$1 \times 5''$ square

Join the assorted strips to the stitchery background square log cabin style.

Transferring The Stitchery Design:

Using a light source, such as a lightbox or a window, place the fabric right side up over the pattern sheet and, using the fine tipped fabric marking pen, trace the stitchery onto the background fabric.

If you are using an iron-on stitchery stabilizer you will need to iron it on before the stitching can be started, by putting this on the back of your stitchery you will not get shadows from the threads on the back of your work.

On close inspection of your iron-on stitchery stabilizer you will see that it is shiny on one side, place the shiny side to the wrong side of your fabric. Following manufacturers instructions bond iron-on stitchery stabilizer to wrong side of your fabric.

The Stitchery:

I used two strands of embroidery thread/floss and did a variety of simple embroidery stitches.


Once all the stitching has been completed you can gently press your work.

Making the ornament:


With right sides together and using $\frac{1}{4}''$ seams stitch all around cushion leaving about 2" unstitched at the bottom. Clip corners and turn through to right side, stuff firmly with toy fill and ladder stitch opening closed.

Stitch the twine in place.






Blind Hem Stitch



Feather Stitch




Blanket Stitch




Cross Stitch

Fill shape by alternating with long and short stitches.




Continue filling shape with long and short stitches.


Running Stitch




Lazy Daisy



French Knot




Backstitch
